Fast Facts about Funding History	• An older foundation (originally focused on supporting the arts) with a more recent national focus on nurse-driven healthcare and helping marginalized patient populations • Funds early-stage (\$50K) and evidence-based (\$250K) intervention projects
Notable Grant Opportunity	Hillman Emergent Innovation This program provides grants to accelerate the development of bold, nursing-driven interventions that improve the health and healthcare of

marginalized populations. For this particular grant mechanism, supports projects focused on the development of bold, early stage (untested or minimal-evidence) interventions. Up to ten \$50K grants for work lasting 12-18 months is anticipated to be awarded.

**Note: The deadline for this year's LOI submission has passed. Next year's LOI deadline is expected to be due in February, but check back on the program page for updates.*

Other Things to Know

- Grant applications begin with a Letter of Intent (LOI) stage, from which a subset of applicants are selected to submit full proposals
- Some Hillman Foundation grant programs are by invitation only, so check the program page to understand eligibility
