Bailey Foundation	Philanthropic Arts Program (P/Arts)	Up to \$10K to implement or enhance programs utilizing art and art education in daily curricula, early childhood education and to assist disadvantaged students. Mellon Foundation	Arts and Culture Program	Support exceptional creative practice, scholarship, and conservation practices while nurturing a representative and robust arts and culture ecosystem.
