Funding Opportunities for Crime & Justice from the National Institute of Justice (NIJ)

Sponsor	Grant/Program	Description	Deadline
NIJ	Research on the Abuse, Neglect, and Financial Exploitation of Older Adults	For rigorous research and evaluation projects in four topical areas: (1) programs that seek to prevent, intervene in, or respond to the abuse, neglect, and financial exploitation of older adults; (2) prevention and education programs related to financial fraud and exploitation of older adults (including the efficacy of scam prevention messaging campaigns); (3) research on individuals who abuse (either financially, physically, sexually, and/or emotionally) or neglect older adults; (4) forensic research involving the development of radiographic evidence and bioinformatic approaches relevant to the physical abuse of older adults.	4/1/24
NIJ	Research and Evaluation on Violence Against Women	Evaluations focused on assessing programs, practices, models, or interventions aimed at (1) enhancing engagement with the justice system for women and girls who have been victimized and (2) improving accountability within the criminal justice system from individuals who engage in or perpetrate violence against women and girls.	4/17/24

NIJ	Research and Evaluation on Firearm Violence and Mass Shootings	Research and program evaluation projects specific to the intervention and prevention of intentional, interpersonal firearm violence and mass shootings in the United States. Two categories: 1) research on mass shootings, including insider threat and leakage and the role of the news media and social media platforms; and 2) research on the effectiveness of campaigns implemented in school systems and/or through school personnel to encourage the parents, guardians, and relatives of school-aged children to store firearms safely and securely.	4/29/24
NIJ	Research and Evaluation on Hate Crimes	Research and evaluation projects to inform policy and practice to prevent and respond to hate crimes: 1) Evaluations of federal-, state-, or locally funded efforts to combat hate crimes. Research that informs strategies to prevent hate crimes; 2) Research and evaluations of strategies to improve the reporting identification, and response to hate crimes; 3) Research and evaluations of strategies to improve outcomes for survivors and their communities.	4/29/24
NIJ	Research and Evaluation on 911, Alternative Hotlines, and Alternative Responder Models	Seeks research and evaluation proposals on the ability of 911 and alternative, three-digit service numbers (e.g., 311, 211, 988) to assess public service and safety needs and respond to them safely, efficiently, effectively, and equitably.	4/30/24
NIJ	Research and Evaluation on Drugs and Crime: Money Laundering, Firearms, and Human Trafficking	Seeks applications for funding rigorous applied research on drugs and crime to inform the development of evidence-based tools, practices, and policies for state, tribal, and local law enforcement and other criminal justice agencies that address drug trafficking, drug markets, and drug-related violence.	5/1/24
NIJ	Measurement of Community Perceptions	Seeks applications for research on, and demonstration projects of, improved approaches to measuring community perceptions of policing and public safety. Specifically, NIJ seeks to fund research that develops and tests innovative methods to provide representative samples that are accurate across microgeographic areas, cost-effective, able to be implemented frequently, and scalable for use in municipalities of various sizes.	5/16/24
