NIH	Exploratory Clinical Neuroscience Research on Substance Use Disorders (R61/R33)	Support clinical research applications that are exploratory and developmental in nature and focus on understanding the neurobiological mechanisms underlying substance use disorders (SUD) , including fundamental brain function relevant to substance use.	5/7/2023
NIH	Understanding Suicide Risk and Protective Factors among Black Youth (R01)	Encourages research that is designed to identify neurobiological, behavioral, social, and structural/systemic mechanisms underlying risk and protective factors for suicide among Black youth , with consideration for identification of novel targets for future development of prevention and intervention efforts.	6/20/2023
NIH	Mechanisms of Alcohol Tolerance (R21/R33)	Focuses on sensitivity and tolerance mechanisms underlying the development of alcohol use disorder to: (1) develop hypotheses about cellular, molecular or network mechanisms that regulate sensitivity and tolerance to alcohol, and (2) develop quantitative models to predict the development of tolerance and the progression to alcohol use disorder.	6/16/2023 (additional deadlines: 10/16/23, 2/16/24)
NIH	Initiation of a Mental Health Family Navigator Model to Promote Early Access, Engagement and Coordination of Needed Mental Health Services for Children and Adolescents (R01)	Encourage research applications to develop and test the effectiveness and implementation of family navigator models designed to promote early access, engagement and coordination of mental health treatment and services for children and adolescents who are experiencing early symptoms of mental health problems.	6/5/2023 (additional deadlines: 10/5/23, 2/5/24)
