- Originated in 1992 via a Congressional appropriation to foster novel approaches to biomedical research in response to the expressed needs of its stakeholders—the American public, the military, and Congress

Three opportunities are currently open under CDMRP’s Alzheimer’s Research Program, which are listed and linked above. Funding ranges from \$1M-\$1.8M per award for up to 3-4 years. Across the awards supports research, including clinical trials, to address knowledge gaps, reduce risk, facilitate diagnosis, and improve quality of life for patients and caregivers connected with Alzheimer’s disease.
