ACLS	ACLS Fellowships	Invites applications from scholars pursuing research on topics grounded in any time period, world region, or humanistic methodology . ACLS	Digital Justice Grants (see <i>Description for links</i>)	Two related grant mechanisms designed to promote and provide resources for projects that diversify the digital domain, advance justice and equity in digital scholarly practice, and/or contribute to public understanding of racial and social justice issues: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Seed Grant: \$10K-\$25K for projects in the start-up or prototyping phase of development - Development Grant: \$50K-\$100K for projects with evidence of significant preliminary work as well as a record of accomplishment and impact with scholarly audiences 	12/15/2023
