NEH	Collaborative Research	Aims to advance humanistic knowledge by supporting <i>teams of scholars</i> working on a joint project leading to a tangible interpretive product. Teams may propose research in a single field of study or interdisciplinary work. NEH encourages partnerships with researchers in the natural and social sciences, but projects must focus on humanistic content and employ humanistic methods.	11/19/25
NEH	Media Projects	Supports the development, production, and distribution of <i>radio programs, podcasts, documentary films, and documentary film series that</i> engage general audiences with humanities ideas in creative and appealing ways. Projects must be grounded in humanities scholarship and demonstrate an approach that is thoughtful, balanced, and analytical. Media Projects offers two levels of funding: Development and Production.	1/15/26
NEH	Landmarks of American History	Situate the study of topics and themes in the humanities within sites, areas, or regions of historic and cultural significance to expand	2/11/26

	and Culture for Higher Education	participants' <b>knowledge of and approaches to teaching</b> diverse histories, cultures, and perspectives in the United States and its jurisdictions.	
NEH	Institutes for Higher Education Faculty	Professional development programs that convene higher education faculty from across the nation to deepen their understanding of significant topics in the humanities and enrich their capacity for effective scholarship and teaching.	2/11/26
NEH	<u>Fellowships</u>	Competitive awards granted to <i>individual scholars</i> pursuing projects that clearly articulate a project's value to humanities scholars, general audiences, or both. Provide recipients time to conduct research or to produce books, monographs, peer-reviewed articles, e-books, born-digital materials, translations with annotations or a critical apparatus, or critical editions resulting from previous research. Projects may be at any stage of development.	4/10/26
